(for students who enter 9<sup>th</sup> grade in 2018-19 and beyond)

22 Standard Credits, 5 Verified Credits

English: 4 credits / 2 verified credits

Courses shall include English 9, 10, 11 and 12 or an advanced equivalent.

Math: 3 credits / 1 verified credits

Courses shall include at least two different course selections from among Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra Functions and Data Analysis, Algebra II, or other mathematics courses above the level of Algebra II.

Science: 3 credits / 1 verified credit

Courses shall include at least two different course selections from among Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, or Physics or completion of the sequence of science courses required for the IB Diploma.

Social Studies: 3 credits / 1 verified credit

Courses shall include U.S. and Virginia History, U.S. and Virginia Government and one of the following: World History to 1500; World History from 1500.

Health and Physical Education: 2 credits

CPR/First Aid/AED Training. Courses shall include Health PE I and II. Students will meet the CPR/First Air/AED Training requirement while enrolled in an HPE I and II course in Prince William County Public Schools.

Economics/Personal Finance: 1 credit

(Virtual course component included with this class) Students will meet the Virtual Course graduation requirement after taking and passing this course in a Prince William County School.

**Electives:** 4 credits

Courses shall include two electives which are sequential and one elective which qualifies as a World Language or Fine Arts, or Career Technical Education course. The World Language or Fine Arts, or Career Technical Education course credit may be used to partially satisfy the sequential elective requirement.
